

## **REGULATORY AFFAIRS FOR BIOPHARMACEUTICALS INCLUDING ATMPs**

### **Seminars, Certificate Programme and Postgraduate Master Course**

#### **Entry Requirements**

##### **§ 1 SCOPE**

This guideline specifies the entry requirements for the Postgraduate Master Course “Regulatory Affairs in Biopharmaceuticals including ATMPs” of the European Centre of Regulatory Affairs Freiburg (EUCRAF).

##### **§ 2 ADMISSION NUMBER AND DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION**

1. A maximum of 30 students are admitted each year to the Postgraduate Master Course “Regulatory Affairs in Biopharmaceuticals including ATMPs”.
2. The deadline for application is 31 July of the year to start with the course in September. As the course can be started with any seminar, in this case the application should be sent six weeks in advance of the seminar intended to start the course with.
3. For each seminar, additional attendees are admitted who wish to take an individual seminar only.

##### **§ 3 CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION AND ACCREDITATION**

1. Prospective students for the course must hold a degree in either pharmacy, biology or medicine or another relevant natural science or health subject.
2. Candidates are eligible for enrolment into the course, providing their primary degree is from a recognized institution.
3. Qualification in English language competence, if English is not the first language.
4. Exceptions may be made to the stipulations listed under 1-3, by agreement of the Admission and Examination Committee.

##### **§ 4 APPLICATION**

1. Application is made in writing using the application form available from the EUCRAF website. The written application must include:
  - Proof of completion of a degree as defined by § 3
  - Proof of knowledge of the English language as defined by § 3
  - Detailed curriculum vitae, with signature
  - A list of scientific and other activities relevant to the proposed attendance of the course
  - A short written resumé, describing the reasons why the candidate wishes to pursue this postgraduate course.
2. The Admission and Examination Committee shall decide on the suitability and accreditation of candidates.
3. Admission and refusal notices will be sent to candidates within four weeks. Accredited study candidates must accept their places on the course and transfer payment of the course fees within four weeks. If this deadline is not observed, the place will be reassigned.
